

Magnetic Resonance Imaging

Welcome and thank you for choosing Augusta Health Magnetic Resonance Imaging (MRI). You are scheduled to have a MRI scan. Your physician has referred you to have images taken to diagnose medical condition(s) and or injuries.

After you have been registered, you will be greeted by your care provider (MRI technologist or nurse) involved with your exam today. Your care provider will take you to the CT/MRI prep area to a private room. The care provider will explain your exam(s) to you and review your medical history form. You will be asked to change into a gown for your procedure. This will allow for the best imaging results during your test(s). If you need help getting ready, please let the care provider know, they will be glad to help you. An IV may be started at this time for MRI dye to be injected into the body for the scan.

What should I expect?

Once prepped for the MRI scan you will be escorted to a MRI room and placed on the table on your back. The MRI Technologist will explain the duration of the test, as well as what to expect during the scan, provide you with headphones that music will play through, and hand you a call bell to squeeze if you have an urgent need during the exam.

Depending on your scheduled procedure you can expect your exam to last a minimum of 20 minutes and up to 60 minutes. If an IV was started, the technologist will enter the room and inject the MRI contrast through the IV towards the end of the exam.

Our goal today is to assure your privacy while being sensitive to your needs and comfort during your visit. Should you have any questions and or concerns prior to or after your exam please feel free to ask your MRI technologist.

If there is anything we can do to help make you more comfortable during your visit to Augusta Health please let us know.

Once your exam is completed, a Radiologist will review the images and send a written report to your physician within 3 to 4 business days.
